- Initiated by colleagues at the Department of African Languages and Cultures





GAP – IN GENERAL

Initial central objectives:

- Mapping all Africa expertise at Ghent University Association
- Making that expertise available to academic and non-academic stakeholders
- Facilitating and enhancing academic collaboration with partners in Africa

Has indeed resulted in:

- Increased numbers of research projects & joint PhD's
- More student mobility and bilateral agreements
- Visibility of AUGent expertise on Africa

- Hogeschool Ghent/Hogeschool West-Vlaanderen /Arteveldehogeschool

Centralised mapping of all academic Africa-expertise is unique in Belgium




